Review Minutes – Minutes of 02/04/2019 accepted with the correction of the year (2019, not 2018). Also noted that the same mistake is on the January 2019 minutes.

Review Determinations & Add Justifications

Volume 6

1909-03-09-11 – From southeast side of snowmobile bridge just upstream from the steel bridge at Fowler's Mill to Fowler's Mill Road. Names fit. Old Roadway is still visible.

1911-03-14-08 – section of road (Rte. 16); William James' stone trough, now the Peters place. William James place is well known. Old roadway visible on LIDAR.

1917-03-13-14 – from Rt. 16 to Madison line south of Moore's Pond. Goes right through Chocorua Ski and Beach. Road shown on Hurd 1890 map. There is still a town line post where it crossed into Madison.

1917-03-13-16 – road on south side of Great Hill Rd. From Brown Hill Road to bend in Great Hill Road at west edge of Farnum property. E.C. Clarke lived in Grasse (Mock) house. Tom Cleveland remembers fishing Mill Brook on and near “Dow Bridge.”

1918-03-12-13 – Wells Road. Road off Mountain Road to Thompson place on north face of Little Larcom. Names fit. TCNA map. Should verify W.G. Thompson.

Volume 7

1920-03-09-9A – from Ed Sandoz headed east to GHR near Dana Steele's. Annie Hill lived at Sandoz place. Process of elimination. Road shown on Hemenway Forest map; some of it is still followable.

1921-03-08-10 – Breakneck Hill Road between Ed Sandoz house and Cleveland Hill Road. Mason listed in Maude Anderson house in IWCS. Roadway still followable

1922-03-14-9A – Osgood Road but need to research where Addison Osgood lived in 1922.

1922-03-14-16 – East end of Loring Road. D. Little research located Runnells and Balch.

1923-13-13-11 – Road from Banfill on Mountain Road to Ed Sullivan on Lord Hill Road. K. Thompson's memory and road still followable.

1924-03-11-06 – Cleveland Hill Road was straightened from the Mill Brook Bridge to the present intersection with Brown Hill Road. Old roadway is still visible on the ground and on LIDAR.

1924-03-11-11 – Peabody owned Cannon residence. Difficult to pinpoint exact location. This will be first on agenda for next meeting.

Next meeting – Wednesday, May 1, 7 pm at the Town Offices.

Adjourn – Meeting adjourned at 9:01 pm.
